#### **POPULATION**

In 2000, the region's total population reached 6,147.000. The population increased by 6% from 1995. In 1990, the urban population was 36% of the total population.

#### **CULTURAL GROUP**

The region's ethno linguistic native to the inhabitants of Western Visayas are: **Hiligaynon**, spoken in **Iloilo**, **Negros** 

Occidental, Guimaras, and Capiz (where it is known as Capiznon). It is the lingua franca of the Region.

Antiqueno, spoken in Antique. Kinaray-a, spoken in parts of Antique and parts of Iloilo and Capiz.

Akeanon, spoken in Aklan.

## **CLIMATE**

The province has no pronounced climate. It has a short dry season and is relatively wet the rest of the year.

In the Philippines, an archipelago of thousands of islands, the climate is generally tropical maritime, with a relatively cool season from December to February, when the northeast trade winds prevail, and a hot, humid and rainy season from March to May, before the arrival of the summer monsoon, the temperature increases and reaches the highest levels of the year, especially in the centre-north and the interior of the larger islands: hence, in general the coolest month (or the least hot) is January, while the warmest is May.

## **CURRENCY**

The Philippine Peso is the currency of Philippines. The currency code for Pesos is PHP, and the currency symbol is ₱. For 2017, one Dollar has equaled: Php 51.460.
